ADL Strategy

- Work closely with industry, government, and academia to promote common, open international specifications and standards that will enable reuse and interoperability of learning content
- Promote widespread collaboration that can satisfy common needs
- Enhance performance with emerging learning technologies
- Promote a coordinated implementation process with incentives for organizational and cultural change

 - "enlightened self-interest" at work




ADL Co-Lab

- An open collaborative environment for sharing learning technology research, development, and assessments.
 The Co-Lab goals are to:
 - Collaborate with industry, academia, and government to develop and refine the SCORM
 - Testing, evaluating and demonstrating technical and functional capabilities of ADL content, tools and systems
 - Sharing data, information and lessons learned with government, industry and academia

The ADL Co-Lab in Alexandria Virginia serves as the ADL Initiative's central organization for guiding, coordinating and integrating the operations of the ADL Co-Lab Network and operates under the direction of the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD).






