Content for Tertiary Education

- University of Santo Tomas (Catholic University) has built the most extensive elearning system implementation
 - Uses Blackboard for LMS
 - Has developed fully-online courses
 - More than 50% of student population enrolled by end SY2005
 - Has extended elearning services to vocational skills development in a public institution (TESDA)
 - UST's elearning project is named e-Leap, for eLearning Access
 Program

Content for Secondary Education

- Initiated linkage with Partners in Learning (PIL) for SCORM-preparedness of content in secondary and vocational education
 - Leading in development of Entrepreneurship Course (SCO)
 for secondary/vocational education
- Requested sponsorship by Microsoft Philippines for SCORM training (module development and pilot implementation)

Issues/Observations

- Increasing independent deployment of LMS, especially open-source LMS, among small academic units
 - This helps justify the promotion of SCORM
- Content development is emphasized lately in primary education because of both the sector's problems and potentials
- Access by users in secondary education is being improved
