 - SCORM 1.2 LMS

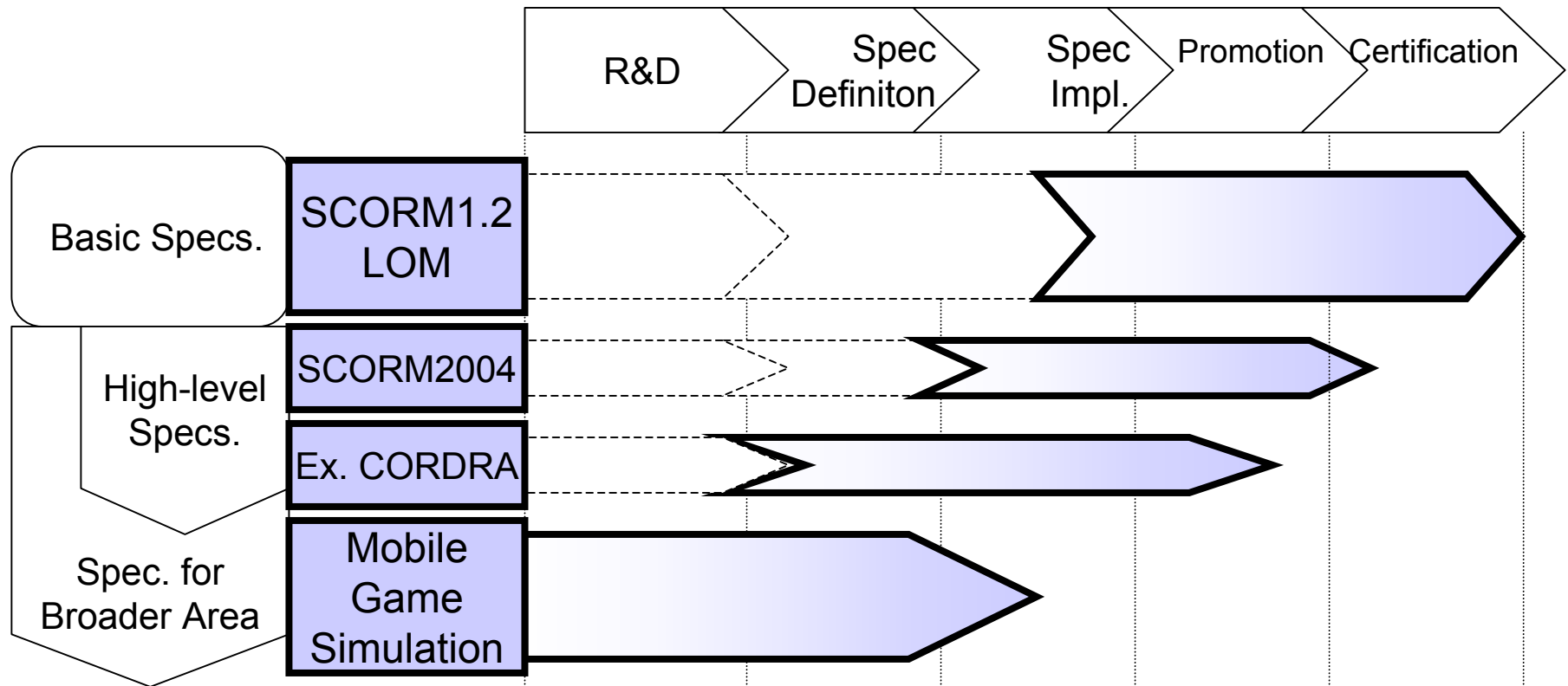
Japan
